ATLAS MOTHS

Atlas Moths live for about 14 Days after hatching. Once they leave their cocoon, they don't eat or drink but focus solely on mating.

PERUVIAN GIANT CENTIPEDE

Peruvian giants are the world's largest centipede reaching up to 12 inches in length and can eat anything smaller than its body – crickets, mice, rats and some reptiles.

PERIODIC CICADAS

Periodic Cicadas can live anywhere from two to 17 years.

MADAGASCAR HISSING COCKROACH

One of nature's most invaluable recyclers, they eat decaying material from the forest.

BLACK CORSAIR

Also known as 'ninjas' because of their XTREME stealth. They normally eat insects but occasionally enjoy blood from rodents and people.
